2026-6-5	Invited speakers & public participation	<p>Cllr Tony Hills tendered his apologies and provided the following report. "Matters I have been engaged with, Romney Marsh ward.</p> <p><b>Water Quality</b> I'm chasing officers at F&amp;H DC to move at pace on the motion passed recently on water quality improvement. The EA water testing started again this month I will be monitoring it on a weekly basis. I have checked the first two results on the .gov website for bathing water quality. Sadley this is the worst start in five years for Dymchurch, let's hope this improves. At the recent 'water users meeting' at the Varne Boat Club, Southern Water supplied an immense amount of data, we were informed that the spend in the district will increase from £11 million to £42 million over the next five years but I can't see how that will help Dymchurch this year. Regrettably the EA was not present, this is not acceptable, I will take this up with the EA.</p> <p><b>Solar Farms</b> The second round of consultations have started with the 'South Brookes' scheme a 'webinar' was held last week to give an overview of the consultation process. <a href="https://southbrookssolarfarm.co.uk/">https://southbrookssolarfarm.co.uk/</a> I will attend the meetings, it appears at first glance that there have been substantive changes, I will report back.</p> <p>Unitary Councils Again, as last month we are still awaiting the decision from Government on which direction will be taken, it shouldn't be long now, once announced F&amp;H DC are ready to swing into action and the real work will begin.</p>	

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		<p><b>Sea defences</b>  I'm still Chasing for a site meeting with the EA and NE to look at the Shoreline Management Plan No. 11 to get it changed to 'Hold the line' for section 4C-14. I took our MP down to Galloways to get his support for the 'Hold the line' change. If a 'set back sea defence would be required under the current plan it could cost 50 million pounds. I think our MP now has a better idea of the real scale of flood threat to the Romney Marsh.</p> <p><b>Climate Change</b>  I was very pleased to hear from KCC the good news that funding had been agreed by the Southern Region Flood &amp; Coast Committee to finance over two years a 'deep dive' on how we can protect the Romney Marsh against more extreme weather and rising sea levels.  Concerns over the 'mud'  I have had disturbing reports from local people who are sinking into the mud. From Dymchurch to Greatstone reports of more sinking mud than usual. So, F&amp;H DC is to place warning signs where the public access the beach.  Problems with cyclists  On Saturday 23rd of May a two year old child was hit on the seawall by a cycle. Thankfully the child had no broken bones but suffered possible concussion. I will speak to F&amp;H to see if we can what can be done to make the sea wall safer for all.
